

## Black History Month: Reviewing the Data

Black applicants have been underrepresented, though there are signs of change...




This growth is largely down to New Voices 2018, for which **7.5%** of applicants were black – more than double the figure for the UK population.<sup>1</sup>

Black applicants were on average a similar age to applicants of other ethnicities...

## Black applicants were more likely to be based in London




All applicants based in London

However, note that the figure for black applicants is broadly in line with the UK's black population, roughly 61% of whom live in the capital. By contrast, London-based applicants overall were overrepresented by a ratio of 3:1.
